

# Artists open their studios to the public

THIS year's South East Open Studios is celebrating its largest ever entry with 276 artists taking part throughout Kent and East Sussex.

It runs from tomorrow (Friday) until June 21, giving visitors the opportunity to meet artists in their studios and talk to them about their work.

Participating artists include professional and keen amateurs from a wide variety of art practices as well as those who have sold internationally. Each studio is different and many artists will be demonstrating their art.

She will display new work including flowers, abstracts, architecture, landscapes and emulsion lifts.

Liz will also be demonstrating the emulsion lift process and will be available to talk about the different cameras she uses.
